William Vredenburgh's Revolutionary War Discharge Certificate

William Vredenburgh's Revolutionary War discharge certificate was highlighted in the National Geographic TV program, <u>America's Lost Treasures</u> that aired July 27, 2012. This certificate is in the possession of James Speegle. I created a word document from screen shots of the TV program.

James and I have corresponded. He does not know how his family came into possession of the document, but here is a possible explanation. James Speegle is a descendent of James Reed. James Reed was commissioned 2nd Major of the First Regiment of Dutchess County, New York Minute Men, October 17, 1775. He served under Col. John Van Ness. This is not the same unit William served in.

On page 9 of my 1997 paper "A Biography of William Vredenburgh, Revolutionary War Veteran," I document that William sold the bounty land he was awarded for serving in the First New York Regiment to a James Reed. I can only presume that Reed had to present the discharge paper to obtain title from the government bureau that dispersed the land.


